

At a recent studio concert, my last student shared that he'd be performing the third movement of Beethoven's Moonlight Sonata. "Please forgive any mistakes," he said, "because I'm a little nervous. But I really love this piece, and I hope you love it too." His words were simple, but they landed with a kind of quiet power. In that moment, he wasn't just a student giving a recital—he was a musician inviting us into something deeply personal. His vulnerability, his love for the music, and his wish for connection turned the performance into something more than notes and technique. It became a shared experience.
