
Active Listening

The key to being an active listener lies in making a sincere effort to absorb what someone else is saying and feeling. Active listening is a deliberate attempt to grasp and understand the facts and underlying feelings of what is being said. Music teachers can show how much we understand by giving appropriate feedback. Listen with your eyes. Listen with your body. Nod your head. Look at the person. Provide verbal encouragement. There's a lot involved. How are you at active listening?
