## This Week's Tip

What do music teachers do when a student plays something uneven, hesitant, or half-prepared? Is our instinct to fix it immediately? How

about -- **Pause. Listen again. Ask a clarifying question.** Small moments of slowing down can widen our awareness and may reveal the issue isn't what we first thought. It might be coordination, confidence, misunderstanding, or simply fatigue. Five extra seconds of music teacher observation can feel like giving the student five extra breaths of possibility.
